INTRODUCTION

Ayurveda is one of the most ancient systems of medicine in India as well as all over the world. Ayurveda system of medicine not only deals with diseases but also equivalently deals with preventive aspect of health.

Among all the parts of the body *Shirah* is considered as "*Uttamanga*" and it is the *Ashraya* of the *Prana* and centre of all *Indriyas*^[1].*Ardhavbhedaka Roga* is one among the *Shirorogas* mentioned in *Ayurvedic* texts^{.(2)}.*Chakrapani*, the commentator of *Charaka Samhita* had cleared up the term *Ardhavbhedaka* by saying "*Ardha Mastaka Vedana*"⁽²⁾

Acharya Charaka stated that Ardhavbhedaka is due to vitiated Vata or in combination with Kapha which seizes the one half of the head and causes acute neuralgic pain in the side of Manya Pradesh, Bhru, Shankha, Karna, Akshi or forhead of one side. This pain is very agonizing like that of churning rod. If this condition become aggravated it may even impair functions of the eye and ear. (3)

Ardhavabhedaka is one of the Shiroroga which can be correlated with Migraine having symptoms like paroxysmal one-sided headache. This condition is characterized by the unilateral headache with paroxysmal nature and associated with symptoms like photophobia, nausea, vomiting, and sensory abnormalities.

It is highly prevalent in India (2014), and associated with substantial disability. Prevalence was greater among females (31.6%) vs. among males (18.5%) and in rural areas (28.9%) vs. urban areas(21.7%). With changing lifestyle patterns, irregular dietary habits, increased mental stress, and exposure to environmental triggers, the prevalence of migraine is increasing globally. Modern pharmacological approaches, including analgesics, triptans, and prophylactic drugs, often provide temporary relief but are associated with significant side effects and dependency risks.

NEED FOR STUDY

In the current era, migraine is one of the most common neurological disorders, affecting approximately 15–20% of the global population, with a higher prevalence in women. It is ranked by the World Health Organization as one of the leading causes of years lived with disability. In today's lifestyle, stress, irregular diet, lack of sleep, and mental strain have made such headaches more common, affecting both personal and professional life. Modern treatment options, though effective for symptom relief, often have limitations such as recurrence, drug dependency, side effects, and high cost, thereby necessitating exploration of safer, sustainable, and holistic approaches.

Ayurveda has a variety of natural medication in the treatment of various types of Shiro-Roga. Early and appropriate management of Ardhavbhedaka is essential to prevent chronicity, reduce attack frequency, and improve quality of life. Classical formulations, Panchakarma procedures (e.g., Nasya, Shirodhara), and lifestyle modifications based on Nidana Parivarjana hold significant potential for preventive as well as curative care.

To compare the efficacy of *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya* and *Pathyadi Kwatha Pana* in the management of *Ardhavbhedaka* with special reference to Migraine.

OBJECTIVES

- 1.To study the etiopathogenesis and symptoms of *Ardhavbhedaka* with special reference to Migraine.
- 2.To evaluate the efficacy of *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya* in the management of *Ardhavbhedaka* with special reference to Migraine.
- 3. To re-evaluate the efficacy of *Pathyadi Kwatha Pana* in the management of *Ardhavbhedaka* with special reference to Migraine.

HYPOTHESIS

❖ NULL HYPOTHESIS(H₀)

- 1. There will be no significant effect of *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya* in the management of *Ardhavbhedaka* with special reference to Migraine.
- 2. There will be no significant difference between the efficacy of *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya* and *Pathyadi Kwatha Pana* in the management of *Ardhavbhedaka* with special reference to Migraine.

ALTERNATE HYPOTHESIS (HA)

H_{A1}: There will be significant effect of *Pathaydi Kwatha Nasya* in the management of *Ardhavbhedaka* with sepecial reference to Migraine.

H_{A2}: *Pathaydi Kwatha Nasya* will be significantly effective than *Pathaydi Kwatha Pana* in the management of *Ardhaybhedaka* with sepecial reference to Migraine.

H_{A3}: *Pathaydi Kwatha Pana* will be significantly effective than *Pathaydi Kwatha Nasya* in the management of *Ardhaybhedaka* with sepecial reference to Migraine.

REVIEW OF LITERATURE

❖ DISEASE REVIEW

Charaka Samhita

The text identifies a total of nine types. *Acharya Charaka* mentioned five types of *Shiroroga* in *Ch.Su.*17: *Vataja Shiroroga*, *Pittaja Shiroroga*, *Kaphaja Shiroroga*, *Krimija Shiroroga*, and *Sannipataja Shiroroga*. Their symptoms, prognosis, and treatment approaches are elaborated in *Chikitsa Sthana*. Additionally, four more varieties—*Shankhakaha*, *Ardhavabhedaka*, *Suryavarta*, and *Anantavata*—are described in *Siddhi Sthana* (Ch. Si. 9). (8)

Sushruta Samhita

In Sushruta Samhita, Uttara Tantra (Su. Ut. 25/3–4) outlines eleven distinct types of Shiroroga along with their therapeutic measures. These include: Vatika Shiroroga, Paittika Shiroroga, Kaphaja Shiroroga, Raktaja Shiroroga, Sannipataja Shiroroga, Kshyayaja Shiroroga, Krimija Shiroroga, Anantavata, Shankhaka, Ardhavabhedaka, Suryavarta. (9)

Ashtanga Sangraha

In *Ashtanga Samgraha* (A.S.Ut. 27/20–21), *Acharya Vagbhata* describes ten varieties of *Shiroroga* along with their management, referring to them collectively by the term *Shirasatapa*. These are:*Vataja Shiroabhitapa*, *Pittaja Shiroabhitapa*, *Kaphaja Shiroabhitapa*, *Raktaja Shiroabhitapa*, *Sarvaja Shiroabhitapa*, *Krimija Shiroabhitapa*, *Ardhavabhedaka*, *Shirakampa*, *Shankhaka*, *Suryavarta*. (10)

Ashtang Hridaya

Ashtanga hridyakara also explains ten types of shiroroga and their Lakshanas and their treatment in 23rd chapter of uttartantra. (11)

Madhava Nidana

In *Madhava Nidana* (Chapter 60), *Acharya Madhavakara* presents a classification of eleven types of *Shiroroga*, drawing from both *Sushruta* and *Charaka* traditions.

Sharangdhara Samhita

In the 7th chapter of *puravakhanada* of *sharangdhara samhita*, ten types of *shirorogas* are described as per *Ashtanga Hridya*.

Bhavaprakasha

Acharaya Bhavamishra has mentioned eleven types of shirorogas and its management in 62 chapter of Madhyamakahanda

DRUG REVIEW

The trial drug under consideration *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya*⁽⁵⁾and comparative drug *Pathyadi Kwatha Pana*⁽⁶⁾ contains the same ingredients are *Pathya*,⁽¹²⁾*Aksha*,⁽¹³⁾*Dhatri*,⁽¹⁴⁾*Bhunimba*,⁽¹⁵⁾ *Nisha*,⁽¹⁶⁾*Nimba*,⁽¹⁷⁾*Amrita*⁽¹⁸⁾

MATERIAL AND METHODS

1. Conceptual Study

Literary aspect of study will be collected from Classical Ayurvedic and contemporary text including the journals and website about the disease and drugs.

2. Clinical Study

• The patients of either sex, suffering from "Ardhavbhedaka" will be selected from OPD and IPD of Jammu Institute of Ayurveda and Research, Nardani and Urban wing, Janipur.

PLAN OF STUDY

- Clinical Study: For Clinical study, patient will be selected from OPD and IPD of Jammu Institute of Ayurveda and Research, Nardani and Urban wing, Janipur.
- **Type of Study:** A randomized, open labelled, comparative, pre and post test clinical study.
- Level of Study: O.P.D. & I.P.D. level.
- **Period of Study:** 18 months

FOLLOW UP

• Follow up:-

GROUP A (*Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya*)- on 11th day, 21th day,45th day **GROUP B** (*Pathyadi Kwatha Pana*)- on 15th day, 30th day and 45th day

• **Drug free Follow up:-** on 45th day

SAMPLE SIZE

30 patients divided in 2 groups of 15 patients in each group.

INCLUSION AND EXCLUSION CRITERIA

❖ INCLUSION CRITERIA

- 1. Patients of either sex of age between 18 years to 60 years.
- 2. Patients with clinical features of Ardhavbhedaka i.e.Headache, Nausea , Vomitting, Aura.
- 3. Patients with Chronicity of disease more than 6 months and less than 3 years.
- 4. Patients willing to participate and able to provide signed informed consent.

***** EXCLUSION CRITERIA

- 1. Patients who are suffering from Hypertension, Diabetes Mellitus and likewise other Chronic diseases.
- 2. Patients suffering from Cervical Spondolysis, Middle ear infections, Trigeminal Neuralgia and Refractive error.
- 3. Patients suffering from Fever, Sinusitis.
- 4. Patients suffering from Secondary Headaches caused by Meningitis, Tumour Encephalitis.
- 5. Patients with history of Head injury and Brain Infections.

DRUG SELECTION AND PREPARATION

✓ Collection of drugs :-

• Ingredients of trial drug *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya and Pathyadi Kwatha Pana* will be procured from the authentic sources, identified and approved by Department of *Dravya Guna*, Jammu Institute of *Ayurveda* and Research, Jammu.

✓ Preparation:-

- ➤ **Trial Drug :-** *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya*⁽⁵⁾
 - The raw ingredients of the *Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya* will be taken in equal parts.
 - Pathya, Aksha, Dhatri, Bhunimba, Nisha, Nimba, and Amrita will be made into coarse powder in the Department of Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana, Jammu Institute of Ayurveda and Research, Jammu. Using this coarse powder, Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya will be prepared in accordance with the classical rerferences as mentioned in Bhavprakasha.⁽⁵⁾

Comparative Drug :- *Pathyadi Kwatha Pana*⁽⁶⁾

- The raw ingredients of a *Pathyadi Kwatha Pana* will be taken in equal parts.
- Pathya, Aksha, Dhatri, Bhunimba, Nisha, Nimba, Amrita will be made into coarse powder in the Department of Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana, Jammu Institute of Ayurveda and Research, Jammu.

METHODS OF DATA COLLECTION

Randomization: Randomization will be done by using randomization software from www.randomizer.org.

Sampling Technique:-

- Subjects will be randomized in two groups.
- A special Case Report Format (CRF) containing all the necessary details pertaining to the study will be prepared.
- Data obtained in the group will be recorded, tabulated and statistically analysed.

INTERVENTION:-

❖ Group A (Trial Group)

- Yoga :- Pathyadi Kwatha Nasya⁽⁵⁾
- **Dosage**:- 6 drops in each nostril. (Virechana Nasya) (20)
- **Duration :-** 30 days (3 sittings each consisting of 5 consecutive days; washout period of 5 days)⁽²¹⁾
- **Follow up:-** 11th day, 21th day, 45th day
- **Drug free Follow up :-** on 45th day

➢ Group B (Comparative Group)

- Yoga :- Pathyadi Kwatha Pana⁽⁶⁾
- **Dosage :-** 48 ml twice a day before meals. (22)
- **Duration :-** 30 days
- **Follow up :-** on 15th day, 30th day and 45th day
- **Drug free Follow up :-** on 45th day

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

For evaluating the efficacy of drugs, following parameters will be adopted before and after the completion of clinical trial.

❖ SUBJECTIVE CRITERIA(23)

- 1. Severity of headache.
- 2.Frequency of Headache: Assessed in terms of Frequency in days
- 3. Duration of Headache: Assessed in terms of Hours/day
- 4.Nausea
- 5. Vomiting
- 6. Vertigo
