Sub: Grant of Conditional Permission to Jammu Institute of Ayurved and Research, Nardani, Raipur, Ban Talab Road, Jammu Tawi- 181123, Jammu & Kashmir for admission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course instead of 90 seats and denial of permission for conducting admission with 15 seats in 03 PG courses namely (i) Kayachikitsa -05 seats, (ii) Shalya Tantra- 05 seats and (iii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats for the academic session 2020-21 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's letter No. L-14014/65/2019-EP-1 dated 07.08.2019 related to admission matter for the academic year 2019-20, intimating certain requirements to be fulfilled by the college for consideration of permission for the academic session 2020-21.

2. Further, refer to the CCIM's letter with Ref. No.26-38/2020-College dated 24.11.2020 forwarding therewith recommendation of the college to the Central Government based on thorough examination of the visitation report Part-I, indemnity bond, affidavit & latest details of teaching, non-teaching and hospital staff submitted by the college along with the assessment report, as the physical verification by conduction of inspection could not be carried out in view of present COVID-19 pandemic situation for the A.Y. 2020-21. On examining the same, certain deficiencies have been observed and therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 08.01.2021 to present the case through virtual mode.

3. The observations of hearing committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing, recommendations & assessment report of the CCIM and the Council's letter dated 29.12.2020 of revised status of teachers have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder, and it is found that the College is not fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS)

B. S. Jaiswal
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Course with 90 seats and 15 seats in 03 PG courses namely (i) Kayachikitsa -05 seats, (ii) Shalya Tantra- 05 seats and (iii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats due to the following shortcomings in teaching staff and Animal House i.e.-

- (i) Total availability of teaching staff is 66.6% (including excess) as per CCIM assessment report, against the requirement of 90% for conditional permission as per RMS, 2016. (UG and PG regulations).
- (ii) Total Availability of Higher faculty is 48.38 % (including excess) as per CCIM assessment report, against the requirement of 90% for conditional permission as per RMS, 2016. (UG and PG regulations)
- (iii) Animal House is not available, as RMS, 2016, PG Regulations.

4. Further, on examining the case, as per Ministry's relaxed Policy decision for UG Course only, exclusively for the A.Y. 2020-21, it is observed that the said college is found to fulfil the norms for granting conditional permission for 60 seats instead of 90 seats in UG (BAMS) course only. College has also consented to reduce capacity from 90 UG seats to 60 UG seats exclusively for A.Y.2020-21, vide their letter dated 05.02.2021.


5. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government **to grant Conditional Permission to Jammu Institute of Ayurved and Research, Nardani, Raipur, Ban Talab Road, Jammu Tawi- 181123, Jammu & Kashmir**, for admission with 60 seats instead of 90 seats in UG (BAMS) course and denial of permission for conducting admission with 15 seats in 03 PG courses namely (i) Kayachikitsa -05 seats, (ii) Shalya Tantra- 05 seats and (iii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats for the academic session 2020-21 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to the following:

- i. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college.
- ii. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- iii. College needs to submit their compliance report to CCIM regarding fulfilling the required criteria for its actual permitted intake capacity for UG & PG as per IMCC, MSR, 2016 regulations except for Higher faculty for UG criteria only i.e., relaxation for Higher faculty will be considered if two Lower faculty are appointed in place of 1 Higher faculty of the concerned subject. The compliance report is to be submitted to CCIM within three months from date of issue of permission letter.
- iv. CCTV system along with live streaming to be installed in, one each at one of the classroom (lecture theatre), Pathology lab, OPD Registration with waiting area and the place where Biometric attendance is taken, with access to CCIM (as communicated vide Ministry's OM dated 02.03.2020 to all ASU colleges).
- v. Implementation of Geofencing for ensuring physical presence of Teaching faculty, Students and Hospital staff in the respective ASU College /hospital which is an up gradation of existing required criteria of Biometric Attendance as per 9(3) regulation of IMCC, MSR, 2016. (CCIM will issue detailed instructions in this regard)

6. It is further informed that minimum of 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority of State/UT Government as designated by Central Government vide letter F.No.L.11011/02/2020-EP (1) dated 26.10.2020 for A.Y. 2020-21 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.
8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Board of Governors, CCIM and the Central Government.
9. As per clause 3(1)(a) if IMCC, MSR Regulations, 2016, the following requirements which are required to be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2020, will be examined for considering the permission for the session 2021-22:
- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*, and
 - (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.
10. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2021-22.
11. This relaxation of granting, 60 UG seats instead of 100 UG seats in BAMS course is applicable only for A.Y2020-21.
12. This issues with the approval of Competent Authority.
